

QUINN RETAINS FESTIVAL TITLE

PAISLEY Harriers Robert Quinn retained the Isle of Man Easter Athletics Festival title for a second year over the weekend, while Colby's Brenda Walker stormed home in the Ladies category with a hat-trick of wins.

The Western A.C. mother of three (inset right) was dominant at Douglas on Good Friday, Peel on Saturday, and Douglas again on Sunday where she was simply in a class of her own.

Graham Clarke was the leading local in the Senior Mens category, helping Manx Harriers to third place overall in the team contest. Local school teacher Alan Postlethwaite won the Veteran Mens class, while Louise Davies of Whitby Heath was the top woman.

McCluskey's win in opening athletics event

KÉVIN McCluskey of Copeland won the opening event of the 1992 Easter Athletics Festival, the six mile road race through the streets of Douglas on Good Friday. He clocked 25.06, beating last year's overall champion, Robbie Quinn of Paisley, into second place by half a minute.

The winning time was 35 seconds faster than that achieved by the 1991 winner, Bashir Hussein, of Stockport Harriers. On Friday, fourth placed Graham Clarke of Manx Harriers was the best placed local, with Gianni Epifani, now running for Liver-

pool Pembroke, 11th.

Best local lady was Jane Mooney of Manx Harriers, who was sixth with a time of 34:24. The winner was Lucy Martin of Manchester University.

Great Britain International Steve Partington won the six mile walk, and junior international Carolyn Brown took the honours in the ladies' section.

Veteran takes top honours in even tougher marathon

VETERAN runner John Nixon of Achilli Ratti won the 1992 Manx Mountain Marathon, taking top honours in the event for the first time at the age of 44.

In extremely difficult conditions he beat last year's winner, Alan Hauser of Holmfirth, into second place, with four times champion and course record holder Brent Brindle, of Horwich third. The best placed local was Richie Stevenson, of Manx Fell Runners, who was seventh overall.

The swirling mist and strong north westerly wind made it extremely difficult for competitors, and not surprisingly the winning time, 5:05:58, was well down on Brindle's best ever 4:28:12. However, that didn't detract from a tremendous battle involving the top three runners as far as South Barrule, and between Nivon and Brindle in the closing stages of the
