

CLARKE'S HILL RACE VICTORY HIGHLIGHT OF FESTIVAL WEEKEND

THE overall winner of the 1993 Easter Athletics Festival was John Heap of Liverpool University 'A', who began the weekend with maximum points in the 5.8 mile Douglas road run on Friday evening, and went on to finish ninth in the Peel Hill Race on Easter Saturday.

His team won the four by five kilometre relay event on Sunday, and took the overall prize at the end of the three days.

Lucy Wright of Leeds University dominated the ladies' section, winning all three races, but it was Manchester University who took the team prize, led by junior athlete Jackie Pursey who was second in all three events.

The best result of the weekend by a local was Graham Clarke's excellent victory at Peel. He took over the lead at Corrin's Folly just before the halfway mark, and eventually won by 24 seconds. Graham's performance helped Manx Harriers' 'A' squad to third place in the team section of the Peel Hill Race.

Another outstanding local was Steve Kelly of the Northern AC veterans, who was competing in the older age group for the first time. Steve was 52nd on Good Friday and 44th the following day which helped him on the way to overall victory in the veteran's section.

Best placed local overall was Gianni Epifani, who runs for Liverpool Pembroke. He was 27th in the Douglas run and 14th at Peel. Pauline Kennaugh of Manx Harriers 'A' who was fifth at Douglas and sixth at Peel was the best local lady. Another Manx girl, Sian Pilling of Blackheath, was third on Friday and Sunday.



Sprint finish to **Douglas Road Race**


