Chris Quine, who has the unique record of winning a medal in every Island Games to date, was a fine 12th overall in the men's contest, while Games newcomer Jackie Ashman finished runner-up in the women's after winning the Peel hill event on Saturday.

The ever consistent Quine was 11th in the Good Friday road race around Douglas and Onchan; 14th in the gruelling hill race at Peel; and 12th fastest in the men's 5k relay on Sunday morning — the best local on each occasion.

Manx Harriers and Island Gamesteam-mate Paul Clarke was 17th in the final standings with a 20th and two 18ths; followed by Andy Fox in 25th spot (23rd, 25th and 27th). Keith Callister, who is not selected for Gotland, was 26th overall, two places in front of namesake but no relation Robbie Callister.

Making a rare appearance in a running vest these days, Robbie won the veteran over 40s class with two wins and a second, but it would have been a different story if Easter had fallen a couple of weeks later as Keith is about to join the 40 watt bulb club any day!

Phil Cain of the Northern Club was 38th overall and third vet, while there was an impressive debut from Harriers man Jim McGreggor to finish 47th overall, one place in front of Northern's Bernard Cannan.

Alan Postlethwaite of the Northern Club was 51st overall and first veteran over 50, while clubmate Steve Kelly was 61st and first vet over 45. Overall. Mark Croasdale of Bingley Harriers regained the Easter Festival title with three stirring performances. He was runner-up in the Friday evening road race, but went on to win the Peel Hill event and set the fastest individual time in the relays at Pulrose.

England international Larry Mathews, winner of this year's Manx Airlines half marathon, won the first leg of the three day festival, the 5.3 mile road run around the streets of Douglas and Onchan, but slipped to fourth in the overall order with ninth at Peel and fourth in the relays.

Second and third places were filled by Donald Naylor of Hunters Bog Trotters and Mick Hill of Leeds University.


WOMEN'S FESTIVAL

British students indoor 3000m champion Sheila Fairweather of Glasgow University took the women's title at the first attempt with comfortable wins on the two tarmac events and second at Peel behind new local resident Jackie Ashman.

Jackie was superb on the Saturday, and after sitting in behind Fairweather for most of the return trip to Corrin's Folly, overtook her rival in the latter stages of the decent — digging deep into her resources to pull out a 15 second margin by the finish line outside the Heritage Centre.

NSC brings the Halifax race walking league to a conclusion

THE Halifax International race walking league comes to a conclusion this Sunday on the perimeter roadway at the National Sports Centre in Douglas, starting 10am.

Since October, eight series of walks (senior 10km, senior 5km and junior 1km) have been held at various venues around the Island and 123 competitors of all ages have taken part so far.

Particularly encouraging has been the popularity of the junior walks where 29 youngsters have taken part and 14 are still in the hunt for league honours. It will depend on performances in the last race as to who wins, eight competitors can still score low enough to be league champion.

The 5km race, which is open to men and women and is aimed at giving an event for whom 10km is initially a big step, has had it's best year so far with 27 different competitors facing the starter. It has provided competition for juniors who are in between the lkm event, but too young to tackle 10, others getting back into the sport or newcomers just having a tryout. This event, though not as intense as the juniors, still has titles hanging on the result of the final race.

The 10km event has been the mainstay of the winter league for over three decades. For the first few years of the league, which started in 1964/65, it was actually the imperial seven mile distance and this season reached new heights with 71 taking part in the seven races held. To date 41 competitors can still score in the league where five races are needed to count.

Five of these — Karen Mansell, Carol Bates, Mike Kneale, Simon Cox and Alan Clucas — all must complete the last walk as so far they have only scored in four events.

As to who wins or takes placings in the overall

league title all depends on the final race.

This race incorporates the Isle of Man 10km championship so it will be a mass start, however the league is based on a handicap so league positions will only be known after computations at the conclusion of the event.

It will be a revelation to all competitors when after the race the final league positions are announced.

The awards will be presented by representatives of the sponsors, Halifax International, and it is hoped that they will have a representative or two in the races.

• The next race following the conclusion of the Halifax is the popular 40-mile Manx Telecom sponsored End to End walk, a fortnight on Sunday, April 25, at the Point of Ayre and finishing at the Sound. Further details will be notified nearer the event. Entries are taken on the line.
