Athletics Festival

THE 2001 Easter Athletics Festival is set to go ahead this weekend, almost as usual.

The foot-and-mouth epidemic has affected the planned itinerary of events and also means that as this article went to press the full number of likely competitors was still unknown.

The best estimates suggest that with some stalwarts not travelling and others transferring from the Mountain Marathon, the men's entry could number between 120 and 150 and the women's 30 to 50. As such, 200 is still a possibility overall which would be fantastic in the present situation.

The events get under way at 7pm tonight, Friday, with the traditional round-the-houses road race starting at the TT Grandstand.

Saturday sees a new departure due to the closure of the fells and agricultural land. Rather than the Peel Hill race the athletes will compete over short cross-country courses around Noble's Park.

The women's race is set to start at 1pm and will cover 4,700 metres, with the men setting off an hour later at 2pm, over 6,300m. Course maps will be available from race HQ at the Grandstand.

Then on Sunday the action moves to the NSC for the men's 4x5km road relay and the women's 5km road race, first event off at 10.15am.

The cross-country and NSC road races are excellent spectator courses, so come along and watch, while the Friday night road race is always a spectacular sight as 200 athletes charge down Bray Hill. Any locals wishing to enter

can do so right up to Friday night.

Athletes to watch out for include local resident Colin Moore, who must be the favourite of the definite entries in the men's race. Colin's form is excellent, with 19th in the National cross-country and a sub-30mins 10km this year.

The Norman brothers from Altrincham could prove strong competition, as should Leeds University's Greg Hull.

In the women's event Jenny Clague of Liverpool Harriers and Jackie Ashman of Manx Harriers should be the class athletes in the event.

In the men's team event the first three teams from last year will battle it out again. Will they finish in the same order of Leeds Uni, Altrincham and Manx Harriers? Time will tell.

In the women's section Liverpool Harriers, Leeds and Manchester Unis should all be strong. However Manx Harriers women could pull off a surprise should they all be fit and competing.

A NUMBER of runners, possibly as many as 40, who were entered for the Manx Mountain Marathon will still be coming to the Island this weekend, most of whom will be taking part in the Easter Athletics Festival.

The Manx Mountain Marathon Organisation have arranged a get-together for all the fell runners on Good Friday after the Douglas road race at approximately 8.15pm in St George's FC clubhouse on Glencrutchery Road, where refreshments will be available. Any local fell runners who wish to attend are most welcome.

The junior fell running championships that are due to take place at Peel on Monday, May 7, are now under threat of postponement due to the foot-and-mouth restrictions. A decision will be made by Monday, April 23, as to whether the race can be held.

Fell running has been hit particularly hard in the current crisis, with the last three scheduled races being postponed. The picture in the rest of the British Isles is the same, with all fell races postponed until further notice by the governing body, the Fell Runners Association.

The FRA and the Manx Mountain Marathon Organisation fully support the measures being taken.

Local man Colin mops up in athletics festival

BINGLEY Harriers Colin Moore, who moved to the Island to live last year, was the star of the Easter Athletics Festival.

The 40 year old dominated the men's event in superb style, winning all three races ahead of rivals almost half his age.

He set the scene on Good Friday evening by winning the opening 5.3 mile road race around Douglas and Onchan by some 38 seconds from Andrew Norman of Altrincham.

Saturday's action saw

a change from the normal due to the foot-and-mouth restrictions, and instead of the popular hill race at Peel there were men's and women's cross-country events around Noble's Park.

But the change of terrain did nothing to deter Moore and he romped home victoriously again in front of Andy Norman, whose brother David was a close third.

To wrap-up the Easter title in style, Moore set the quickest individual time in the series of men's 4x5km relays

based on the NSC on Sunday.

On this occasion it was much closer, however, with Andy Norman just one second in arrears at the close.

The latter man had the consolation of winning the relay and the overall team title with his Altrincham AC colleagues.

The women's individual title went to Jenny Clague of Liverpool Harriers, who similar to Colin Moore won all three races from local resident Jackie Ashman.

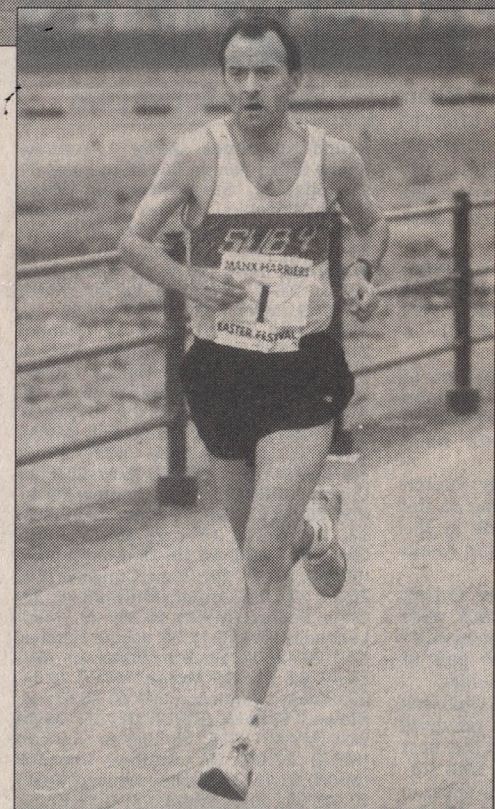
Other impressive local performances were recorded by the Manx Harriers A team of Andy Fox, Chris Quine and Paul Clarke.

Andy was the leading veteran in sixth place overall, finishing on the same points as his two team-mates.

John Halligan, the fourth member of the Harriers A team, was the leading junior in 11th place overall.

Gianni Epifani of Harriers B was 13th, one place in front of former Manx Mountain Marathon winner Shane Green.

Moore makes it look easy with triple success in Easter Festival



Good Friday's round-the-houses 5.3 miles road race attracted almost 150 athletes. The event was won by Manx resident Colin Moore in 26mins 50secs (IP/PW)

ISLAND resident Colin Moore recorded a hat-trick of wins to take overall victory in the annual Easter Athletics Festival, and in doing so becomes only the second ever local athlete to achieve the feat, writes Phil Cain.

Although running in the colours of his home club, Bingley Harriers, the 40 year old former Great Britain international has been a resident in the Isle of Man for just over 12 months and is therefore able to claim Manx status. Without doubt his main threat came from Altrincham's Andrew Norman, who just seven days earlier had beaten the informant Moore at a road race in Leeds. There was no such problem this time, as the Willaston man powered his way to victory in Good Friday evening's round-the-houses road race.

Despite all the ongoing problems in England, almost 150 athletes lined up at the Grandstand to tackle the 5.3 mile course which takes in Bray Hill, Peel Road, South Quay, the promenade and Blackberry Lane before returning back to the Grandstand. Colin's margin of victory was over half a minute from the Altrincham athlete, who had the satisfaction of helping his team take the team award. Douglas schoolteacher Andy Fox had an impressive run with a top six finish, holding off Manx Harriers club mates Chris Quine and Paul Clarke.

Victory in the women's class went to Liverpool Harriers' Jenny Clague, 35th overall, ahead of a delighted Jackie Ashman, the Manx athlete having been sidelined with injuries for the past six weeks. Also worthy of a mention was fourth-placed finisher Marie Noon, showing good form, as did sixth-placed

Due to the obvious restrictions it was no surprise that Peel Hill was out of bounds, therefore the action stayed in Douglas, with the athletes facing a cross-country event at Noble's Park.

First away at mid day were the women, and it was a case of as you were, with ex-GB international Jenny Clague recording her second win of the weekend, again getting the better of Jackie Ashman who took the runner-up spot.

The men's race saw Colin Moore stamp his authority from the off, only Andy Norman prepared to give chase, but it was the impressive Bingley Harrier who showed his class throughout, coming home in front of the

Altrincham man, who in turn held off his fast finishing brother, David, who claimed the third podium place.

Good packing enabled Manx Harriers athletes to take fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth places, with Andy Fox again fastest, just one place ahead of youngster John Halligan who secured the junior men's award. The team prize was again won by Altrincham, with Manx Harriers second.

Sunday morning and the action moved to the NSC, where both the women's race and men's relay saw the athletes take in a two-lap course along the New Castletown Road, down Groves Road and onto Peel Road before returning to the Sports Centre.

Once again it was Jenny Clague who came out on top, repeating her success from the previous two days' racing, and

for a third successive time it was defending champion Jackie Ashman who had to settle for the runner-up spot.

So to the final event, the men's 4x5km relay, and as expected it was a battle between the two leading teams, namely Altrincham and Manx Harriers, with positions changing throughout. It was left to Andy Norman to secure the outright victory for his Altrincham team mates. Anchor man Andy Fox came home in second spot and along with team-mates John Halligan, Chris Quine and Paul Clarke, helped Harriers take the runner-up spot.

Fastest time of the day was set by overall Festival winner Colin Moore, but it was oh-so-close, just one second separating him from Andy Norman. On this form, Colin must be in with a serious chance of getting a gold medal at this summer's NatWest Island Games.

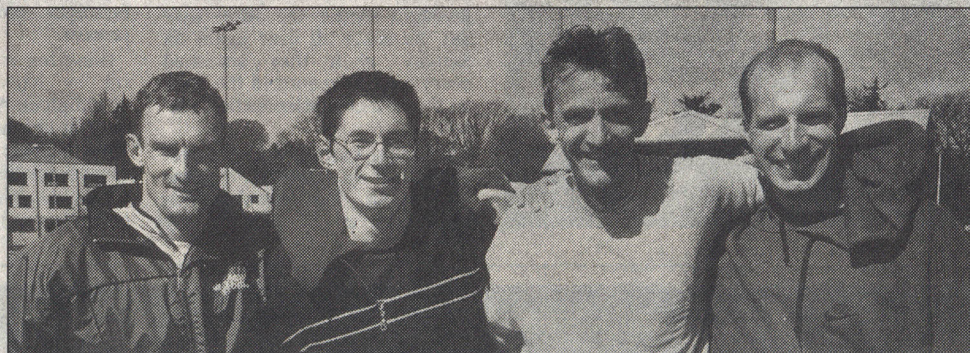
