

brewery sponsored Manx Mountain Marathon looks like being one of the most recently contested races for some years, with at least six runners in with a realistic chance of taking victory in one of the toughest athletics events in the British Isles, writes **Richie Stevenson**.

The Department of Tourism are again given the event their full support.

The race will follow the traditional course from Ramsey to Port Erin, a gruelling 31 miles with 8,000 feet of ascent as it visits 12 summit checkpoints en route.

Entries are, as expected, down around 20 on 2000, the last time the race was run. The drop in numbers was predictable as the sport of fell running is still battling to recover from last year's foot-and-mouth restriction.

Another major factor to affect the Manx in particular is the total lack of entries from the armed forces this year, which in the past has been as many as 25.

The last time that no army personnel took part was the year of the Gulf War, so it can only be assumed that the various terrorist problems in the world have resulted in severe restrictions in the events that the army take part in. So all in all, the organising committee is reasonably happy that there will still be over 100 competitors on the Manx hills this Easter Saturday.

Prospects of a local win are still good, with Manx fell champion Tony Okell one of the favourites. The Tromode man has been pumping in over 100 miles a week in training for the win he

He will not have an easy time of it though, as he will have to see off three previous winners.

The main threat will probably come from Scotland's Colin Donnelly who is still the fastest man ever from Ramsey to Port Erin, albeit on a shorter course than is used now.

The Wales-based former three times British champion recorded a quite fantastic time of 4 hours 2 minutes back in 1980 and then went on to race internationally with considerable success.

He is now in the veterans' class, indeed he was British veteran's champion in 2000, and is definitely one to watch.

The other two previous winners entered are Pudsey's Andy Hauser, who has a record five wins to his credit and who can never be written off, and 1996

Blackhurst emigrated to New Zealand a few years ago and is making the long trip back to have another go. Who could ever forget his 1996 win when he sported his amazing hot-cross bun haircut?

The task of all the favourites has been made easier as a result of the withdrawal of Andy Trigg.

The Derbyshire runner who won in 1999 and 2000 has not yet recovered from a broken ankle, but he has already stated he is determined to run next year.

Others in with a good shout include Clayton-Le-Moor's Paul Thompson, who has finished in the top three on two occasions and has really set his stall out for a win this year, and Mandales' Joe Blackett.

There is a doubt over Teesider Blackett though as, although he fully intended running, his entry had not been received by

Clayton-Le-Moor's Kat Thompson could well score his second win in the female category as defending champion Ruth Pickvance is not entered. Other locals who may cause a few surprises are Portlough's Ian Ronan and Douglas postman Ian Gale. A top 10 finish for both would not be a surprise.

The non-competitive jog/walk leaves Ramsey's Market Square at 7.30am followed by the runners at 9.15am.

● Spectators can follow the race at various spots on the course with the leaders expected at the following times: Black Hill 10.05am; Bungalow 10.20am; Injebreck 10.45am; St John 11.50am; Round Table 1.00pm; Sloc 1.30pm; finish opposite Ocean Castle Hotel 2.05pm.

These times are approximate as the conditions on the day could alter times considerably.

Fox 18th in British Veterans race

ANDY Fox finished 18th in the British Veterans' cross country championships at Mansfield in Derbyshire last month.

On a fast, undulating course of 10km he recorded a time of 34 minutes 17 seconds to finish 15th out of 40 or so runners in the 40-49s class.

After a fast start, he settled into the early 20s and was around 25th at halfway. Over the second half of the course he moved through to 18th, running well on the hilly stretches.

The event was won by Bob Hand in 32.17, while the next three home were former England and GB cross country internationalists as seniors. Andy was approximately one minute down on the sixth place finisher.

Quine always goes well on the road and Andy Fox usually pulls out a good performance in the hill race on the Saturday. Injuries have hampered the preparations of two of the old guard - Gianni Epifani and Paul Clarke. It will be interesting to see how some of the Manx youngsters go, with a group of around 10 of them turning out. Watch out for Darren Gray on Saturday and Glenn Butterworth and Kevin Shimell in the road relay on the Sunday. Young Keith Gerrard will

be an interesting athlete to watch, he could certainly embarrass a few of the local seniors on Friday night.

The team races look wide open, with perhaps the two university teams of Leeds and Manchester being the favourites. Man Harriers A team will be quite different this year but should be up there competing with the best.

In the women's section no individual or team stands out and it will be interesting to see who prevails over the weekend.

Top two cannot be separated in Easter Festival

IN WHAT must be the closest ever finish to the Easter Athletics Festival, the two leading finishers in the men's event were inseparable on the stopwatch after three very different events and a total of more than 12 miles.

Andrew Franklin of Manchester University Alehouse Runners won the two road based events, but Steve Green of Bingley Harriers came out on top in the hill race at Peel.

Their composite individual times for the three events was precisely the same - 65 minutes and 19 seconds!

Franklin made the early bow waves in the 5.3 mile Good Friday road race through the streets of Douglas and Onchan, completing the course in 27

minutes 13 seconds to eke out an initial 12 second lead on his Yorkshire rival.

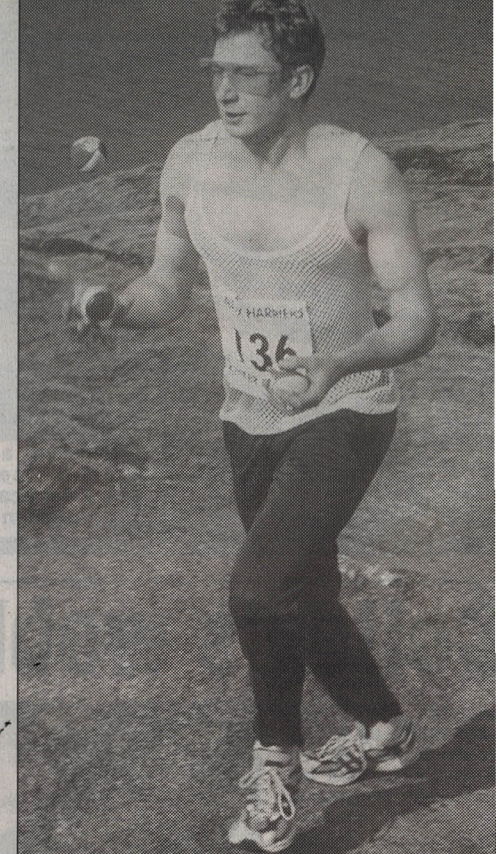
But Green was on top of his game the following day at Peel where, shouted on by Bingley clubmate and 2001 Festival champion Colin Moore, he set a blistering pace for the four-and-a-bit mile course to Corrin's Folley and beyond towards Knockaloe Beg, before returning past the tower and safely negotiating the steep descent to the finish outside the House of Manannan.

At the close he was a full 23 seconds up on Franklin to move into a 12 second lead with the relay still to run.

Both contesting the first leg of the 5km course for their respective teams, it was Franklin who circumnavigated Groves Road, Pulrose Bridge and Peel Road first to cross the finish line in 15m 09s - precisely 12s in front of Green!

Yes, it doesn't come much closer than that.

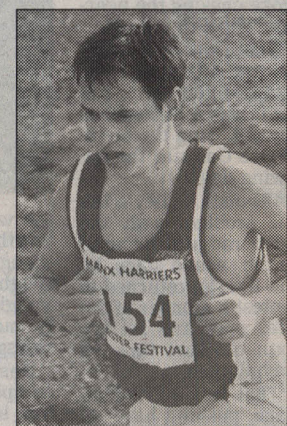

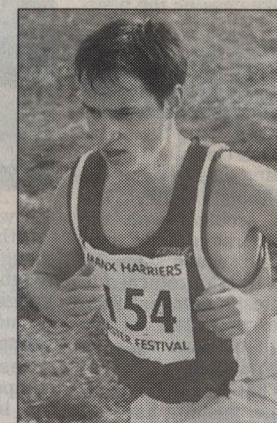

He sat out the hill race to save himself for Sunday's relay, where he promptly set the fifth fastest time of the morning - this time just two seconds behind leading Manxie Fox.

Darren Gray, whilst no longer a junior, is very much one of Harriers promising new squad of talent and he produced his best ever Easter form to place an

impressive ninth in the seniors - five places down on Island Games warhorse Chris Quine. Gray was incredibly consistent, 14th overall in both the Good Friday road race and Saturday hill race, then 15th quickest in the relay which included (as a one-off) Mountain Marathon man Tony Okell in 13th spot.

The third young gun was Glenn Butterworth, who showed great potential in his early teens but appeared to lose his way slightly for a couple of years.

He is most certainly back

now with a vengeance and he fired an early warning shot by sneaking home 20th in the opening event on Friday then moving up to 15th at Peel. His time for the 5k leg of the relay was the 22nd best overall, quicker than Murray Lambden, Bernard Cannan and the star of last year John Halligan. 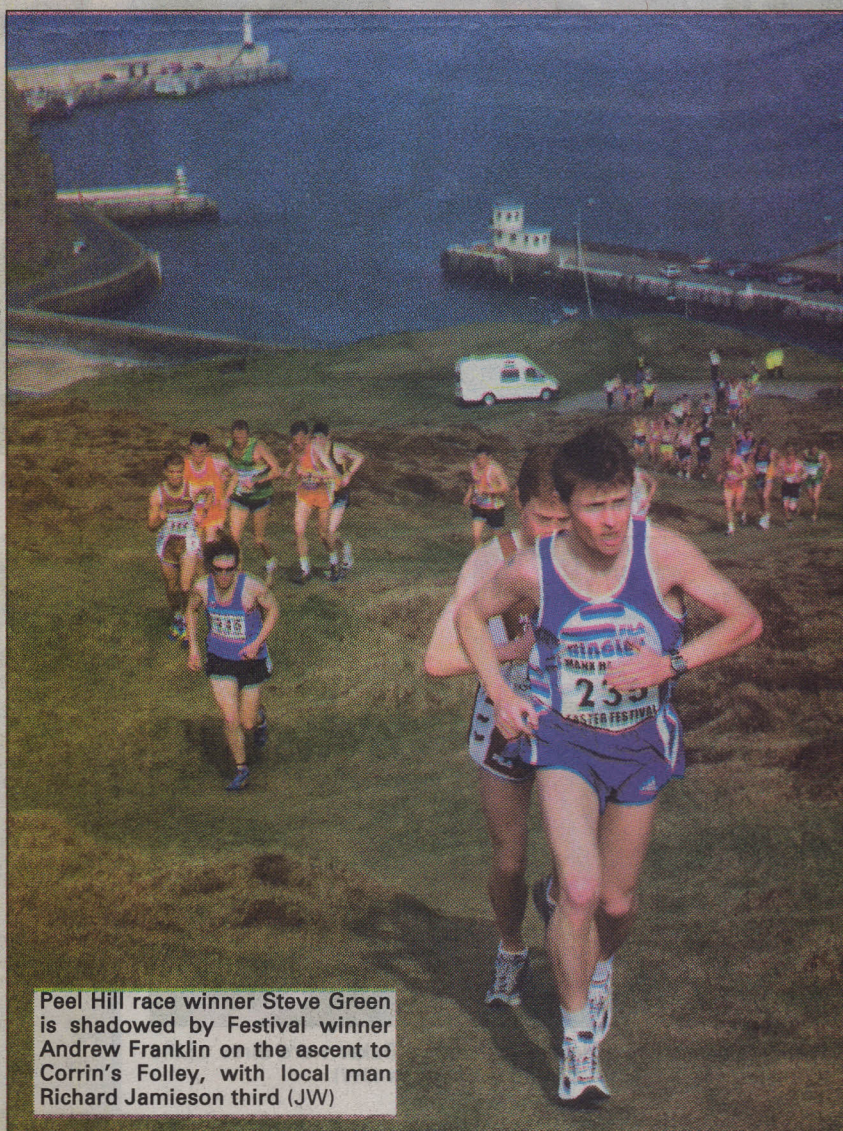
