

Festival 10km win for Gerrard

APPROXIMATELY 240 runners participated in the first leg of the Easter Athletics Festival at Port Erin and Port St Mary on Good Friday evening, but it was Peel's Keith Gerrard (pictured right) who made history by becoming the first Manx athlete to win a leg of the three-day event.

The GB senior international cross-country representative broke free of a group of four runners in the latter stages of the event to win the 10km road race in a time of 30 min 48 sec, crossing the finish line outside of the former Marine Biological Station on Port Erin promenade seven seconds in front of Matt Bond (Manchester Alehouse), with the latter man's team-mate Dave Norman third.

Next best of the locals were Kevin Loundes in sixth and Manx Harriers team-mate Darren Gray in

The women's event was doominated by Leeds/Doss runners, with Emma Waterhouse first across the line in 36.51, from Lisa Da Silva, Clare Duck, Sarah Graham and Gemma Smith.

Easter titles for UK duo

Easter Athletics Festival

ATT Bond of Manchester Alehouse and Emma Butterworth of Leeds/Doss were the overall winners of the 47th annual Easter Athletics

Bond was super-consistent with second places at Port Erin on Good Friday, Peel Hill on Saturday and in the 5km relay on Douglas promenade on Sunday morning (where he was pipped for the fastest time by 0.4 of a second on official timing).

Emma, celebrating her hen weekend (see separate story), retained the women's title she also won last year with individual successes on Friday and Sunday, finishing second behind team-mate Clare Duck in Saturday's hill race.

Kevin Loundes, of the organising Manx Harriers club, had a cracking weekend, finishing sixth, sixth and fifth for an excellent third overall.

Clubmate Darren Gray was ninth overall (18-12-12), while former leading cyclist Christian Varley also finished in the top 20 (18th) with 24-25-20.

Foxdale's Gail Griffiths (Manx Harriers) was the best local in the women's festival. finishing ninth overall.

'We both also run for Chester-le-Street and District Athletics Club and our last pre-marriage race will be a 1,500m event a week before we tie the knot. The money is on me for that one,' she smiled.

They live in Durham and are getting married in Auckland Castle, Bishop Auckland. Emma is a research fellow at the university and James is a science teacher at a secondary school.

Ross Houston, Emma's brother-inlaw, ran the joint fastest single leg in the men's 5km relay on Sunday morning with overall festival winner Matt Bond. Both the bride and groom-to-be's sisters - Claire Houston and Tamsin Raven - also competed.

Emma won the women's Easter Athletics Festival for the second year in succession but prefers track running (1,500m and steeplechase in particular).
